# PASTOR'S MESSAGE

he church isn't a building, but our building at the corner of Stop 11 and Meridian School Roads is certainly where our congregation finds a home. As I've been thinking about the significance of another year of ministry, another year of life together as a congregation, I've been thinking about the place of this church — our place in this community and our place in the lives of you who find here a spiritual home.



Imagine with me all the comings and goings. Think about those who come through our doors to pray or serve a meal. Think about those who come on Tuesdays and Thursdays to learn English. Picture the children eagerly greeting their friends and the newcomer looking for a welcome. Then see in your mind's eye where

people go from here. They get in their cars and they head back to the week's to-do list or to their homework or maybe to a lonely apartment. 

Two grants were made from the Mission Endowment Fund in 2022. One to Bridges Alliance of Johnson County in the amount of \$3,000, and another to the newly formed Afghan American Community Center in the amount of \$3,500. \$3,700 in grant funds remain available through July 2023.
