### **PASTOR'S MESSAGE**

"Tell me about your congregation." That was the beginning of a conversation I had with someone I met recently. I think I started by describing our location, because I really wasn't sure what he wanted to know. But then he quickly followed up, "A pretty typical congregation?" and without hesitation I replied, "Not at all."

If what my new acquaintance meant was, "Do they sing hymns, pray, and learn about faith together?" then I gave him the wrong answer. If he meant, "Do they like to serve their neighbors and do they listen politely to sermons?" then I was off the mark. There are lots of practices and characteristics Resurrection shares with other congregations, but "typical" is one of the last words I would use to describe this community of faith.

We are forward-looking. We treasure our heritage of faith and the gifts of the past, but we believe God is at work in the world today, moving us into the future. I'm not sure this is typical of most congregations. I once heard a devotion based on a story from the gospels where Jesus is in a boat with his disciples crossing from one side of the lake to the other, and two reflection questions were offered: "What does it mean to go to the other side? Is God calling you there?" It's a good reminder that God isn't interested in the shores we've left behind. And we might also consider the possibility that we are on "the other side" now. My sense is that Resurrection people understand that to be people of faith is to be future-oriented. But it also means God's activity isn't just something we wait for. No matter what is happening now, God is present. Coming out of the worst of the pandemic, many of us wondered what kind of world we would find when the dust settled. We wondered what the 'next thing' would be. Perhaps we are living it now. Whatever is happening today is the 'next thing' we were curious about yesterday.



In a very important sense, we have not arrived. God isn't finished with us yet.

Like the Apostle Paul, we know we haven't already obtained everything God has in mind for us. But in another equally important sense, we *have* arrived. We are here. Today. So is God, and God is moving in significant ways. With the beginning of Pastor Kathy's ministry among us, we have ceased, for the first time in quite some time, to ponder what having a full staff would be like. New faces appear in our midst almost every week, and we know there are gifts in this congregation we have yet to discover. There's nothing wrong with being typical, but when so many assume the glory days of the church are over, trusting that even more wondrous things are to come is anything but typical.
